Workshop

Speeding is a complex problem that involves public attitude, personal behavior, vehicle performance, roadway characteristics, enforcement strategies, court sanctions, and speed zoning. Because of this complexity, managing the problem of speeding must involve a broad range of transportation partners and promote a cooperative approach from a variety of disciplines.

This workshop provides the common platform. The workshop format builds on the conclusions of the Transportation Research Board (TRB) Special Report 254, *Managing Speed: Review of Current Practices for Setting and Enforcing Speed Limits*, which brings a holistic approach to speed management. Designed as a multidisciplinary forum, the workshop will bring together practitioners and researchers to address speed-setting and enforcement issues.

Objectives

The workshop objectives are to:

- Identify and describe the actions needed to restore the credibility of speed limits.
- Address the perception that speed limits do not reflect real-world conditions.

Participants will consider:

- Methodologies used to set realistic speed limits.
- Public perception and acceptance of speed management.
- Speed-setting and enforcement technology.
- Engineering concerns.
- Judicial considerations.

Results

During afternoon breakout sessions, participants will identify specific, practical actions they can implement to restore credibility to speed limits on state and local roadways in their communities.
