This is why Federal Highway Administration's (FHWA) Office of Safety provides customized training and technical assistance to States to help them improve and advance their program.


The **HSIP Training and Technical Assistance webpage** (https://safety.fhwa.dot.gov/hsip/training_technical) provides a listing of available resources that specifically support HSIP-related implementation efforts for HSIP, Strategic Highway Safety Plans (SHSP), Rail-Highway Crossing Program (RHCP), and Safety Performance Management. These resources include current trainings, recorded webinars, and videos. For those States that need a more personalized solution, FHWA offers free, custom-tailored technical assistance to meet State-specific needs. Technical assistance can be delivered on-site (when available) or virtually through the following mechanisms:

- ▶ **Assistance from an experienced peer or technical expert.**
- ▶ **Training workshop led by an experienced peer or technical expert.**
- ▶ **Facilitated peer exchange.**
